



01 Tom Moore's Tavern

Nestled within the bounds of Hamilton Parish, the historic Tom Moore's Tavern occupies the property once known as Walsingham House, offering romantic fine dining fit for a king. Literally. Prince Charles himself (now Charles III) once lunched here.



02 Fourways

This upscale-yet-inviting Paget eatery blends French classics with "quintessential Bermudian" fare—topped off with a Wine Spectator award-winning beverage list. Part of an 18th-century cottage colony, this architectural gem of a restaurant provides live piano music for diners to enjoy each and every night.

03 The Waterlot

Perfect if you're in the mood for something iconic, this legendary steakhouse has roots dating back to 1670. Reinvented in 2024, the Waterlot now boasts an award-winning, highly discerning menu of surf-and-turf delicacies, featuring locally sourced ingredients.

04 Harry's

This Hamilton standout—named for famed businessman and treasure diver Harry Cox—has been dishing out quality steaks and signature rum cocktails for two decades, all in the name of a good time. Come for Harry's favorite (the 10oz New York Strip), stay for more unique offerings like the oxtail tacos or the rotating catch of the day. There's a raw bar and seasonal drinks menu, too. Their motto? "Fine food and wine, shared with friends."

05 Little Venice

A taste of Italy in the heart of Hamilton, Little Venice manages to serve up a delectable array of regional European specialties without sacrificing local flavor. Hailed as Bermuda's "first and most famous" Italian restaurant, this island legend offers classics from Campania, Venuto, and the like (the homemade cacio e pepe—prepared at table!—is just one of many) alongside closer-to-home dishes such as traditional rock fish chowder or the dinner menu's ravioli with Bermudian lobster. *À tavolo!*

06 Port O Call

Situated along Hamilton's bustling Front Street neighborhood, Port O Call promises diners an "oasis" of calm amidst the vibrant Bermudian shuffle. Highlights from its colorful, contemporary menu include everything from fresh local fish (think poke bowls, tartare, scallops, shrimp, and more) to pork chops, burgers, and steaks. There's also a 12-page wine list for all you oenophile connoisseurs.

08 Harbourfront

A self-styled "seafood-lovers' dream come true," this 2024 Tripexpert Expert's Choice Award recipient proffers a parade of fish and shellfish delicacies, from lobster and local catches to oysters, octopus, tuna tataki, and more. There's also plenty of non-surf options to enjoy, plus ocean vistas from the nearby Bermuda Underwater Exploration Institute. (Lunch Mon-Fri only.)

09 Intrepid

Open for dinner only, this "contemporary twist" on the traditional American grill and raw bar caters to foodies, art lovers, and interior design devotees alike. Named for a British intelligence agent stationed at the Hamilton Princess Hotel during World War II (code name: "Intrepid"), this exclusive dining experience offers views of the harbor, an impressive collection of modern art, and a deco-style dining room—not to mention its eclectic menu of prime meats, sushi rolls, oysters, and much, much more.

10 Bolero

Hamilton bistro Bolero prides itself on its intimate, convivial atmosphere and deliciously decadent yet decidedly unpretentious dishes. With a menu centered largely on succulent seafood, Bolero combines old-world European taste with inventive culinary flair.

11 Sul Verde

Traditional Italian lets its hair down a little at this buzzing bistro, celebrated for house-made pasta, wood-fired pizza, and more. Literally translated as "on the green," Sul Verde provides a bright, emerald-tinted colonial dining room for those seeking generous "pizze" brimming with unexpectedly delicious toppings or robust entrées like ossobuco and saltimbocca. Reservations are encouraged.

12 Blû Bar & Grill

Fresh meets al fresco at this dinner spot, known for its "bold American with generous Italian and Asian"-influenced flavors and thrilling views of Bermuda's Great Sound and Hamilton Harbour. While guests can dine in or out, Blû's American Cup Deck will probably afford the breeziest, most breathtaking dining experience. Warning: No flip-flops, t-shirts, or collarless shirts (for men) allowed. Whether you're in the mood for sushi or steak, Blû is strictly "smart casual." (Full vegan menu available!)

SEEK THE ADVENTURE



01 Crystal & Fantasy Caves Tour

Guided tours of the not-to-be-missed Crystal and Fantasy Caves—Bermuda's famed underground natural wonder—run from 9:15am to 4:30pm daily. Experience the site's pristine turquoise lake, crystalized stalactites, and shimmering mineral walls as you roam through the caves' intricate pathways (some of which actually float!). Need a break? Next-door dining and a cozy giftshop can help round out your stay.

02 Railway Trail National Park

Grab your bike or hiking boots and prepare to traverse all of Bermuda from end to end (almost). This nine-part trail traces the route of "Old Rattle and Shake," Bermuda's short-lived railway, which operated from 1931 to 1948. Repurposed in 1964, the Railway Trail is now a public park, spanning 18 miles and offering cyclists and adventurers magnificent island vistas alongside a window into Bermuda's history.

03 2-Stop Snorkel & Shipwreck Adventure

Consider this your two-stop shop to snorkel paradise. K.S. WaterSports provides beginner and intermediate snorkelers with a perfect day out, featuring visits to a local shipwreck as well as a reef that's home to sea fans, brain coral, and the occasional lobster, turtle, or ray. Scenic coastal tour comes standard. Some age restrictions apply.

04 Deep Sea Fishing

08 Historic St. George's Walking Tour

Designated as a World Heritage site by UNESCO for "Outstanding Universal Value," St. George's 17th-century English town is the oldest of its kind in the Western Hemisphere. An afternoon spent in this landmark village affords visitors a chance to learn about Bermuda's rich and diverse history, with key stops including State House, St. Peter's Church, Fort St. Catherine, Tucker House Museum, and a trail honoring the island's African Diaspora heritage. Sites vary depending on the tour you choose.

06 Afternoon Grotto Bay Boat Snorkel

Climb aboard Dive Bermuda's fully equipped Narcosis (probably named for its distinctly laid-back vibe) for a three-hour sojourn off Grotto Bay Resort. This snorkeling trip teases parrotfish, butterflyfish, and wrasse sightings, and no prior snorkeling experience is required.

09 Harbour Nights Street Festivals

A weekly tradition from May to August, Harbour Nights offers a bold, beautiful, and flavorful "celebration of Bermudian culture." Local chefs and artisans peddle their wares as traditional Gombey performers—representing Bermuda's African, British, and Caribbean ancestries—dance and drum their way down Hamilton's famous Front Street.


